

Please carry on recognising your Speed Sounds every day, so you do not forget them!

Keep practising writing them correctly using the little phrases, such as 'Down, up, down, up,' (w) and 'round the dinosaur's bottom, up his tall neck and down to his feet.'(d)

Keep 'Fredtalking' throughout the day.

Can you choose a letter sound and look for it in a book? Ask a family member to choose some simple 3 and 4 letter words for you to read and write using your phonics skills. E.g. d-a-d, dad!

Can you write a list of rhyming words?

dad

mad

pad Have a go! You c-a-n, can do it!

Miss Dallamore's group (TADPOLES)

Activity 1 - play an animal themed guessing game. Make some sound effects for different animals and encourage someone to guess what animal sound you're making. You could meow like a cat or hissssss like a snake.

Activity 2- Use your voice to make sounds like a car, a dog, a ghost, a train and bubbles under water.

Do something special and kind for your dad/ Grandad this week.

For example:-

Draw him a lovely picture!

Tell him that you love him!

Share your snack with him!

Decorate a 'Dads rock' for him or make something else he would like!

Give him a hug!

Give him a compliment (say something nice about him!)

Physical Development

Fine Motor

Practise always using the correct pencil grip (holding your pencil at the bottom between your thumb and first 2 fingers) for writing and drawing in your dad's Father's Day card.

Gross Motor

Create a Physical Skills Challenge for the whole family to enjoy!

Balance on one foot and count to 5

Jump on the spot 10 times

Sit down and slowly stretch to touch your toes 8 times

Run fast on the spot and count to 20

Hop on 1 foot 6 times

Do 7 star jumps

Health and Self Care

Keep remembering to wash your hands really well with soap and count to 20!

Communication and Language

Why is your dad/ Grandad/ Grandpa so special?

Talk to a family member about why you love your daddy using the sentence starter

'I love my daddy/ Grandad because...'

he is funny and makes me laugh/ he plays with me/helps me etc.

Literacy (Reading)

Watch 'I love my daddy' by Giles Andreae being read on Youtube

Can you learn our Summer term poem from 'The Poetry Basket' with the help of your family?

Sliced Bread

Slice, slice, the bread looks nice.

Literacy (Writing)

WRITE IN YOUR FATHER'S DAY CARD!

Frogs Phonics group

Try and write a simple message to your daddy on your own using your phonics. You could simply write

To daddy

love from

... XXX

Tadpoles phonics group

Try and write some letters from your name inside the card. Do not forget some kisses! XXX

Mathematics

Sing number songs and rhymes

- 5 little ducks
- 1,2,3,4,5, Once I caught a fish alive
- 10 green bottles
- 5 little peas
- 1 little 2 little 3 little fingers
4 little 5 little 6 little fingers
7 little 8 little 9 little fingers
10 fingers on my hands!

Can you show numbers by using your fingers, marks on paper or pictures?

Can you start to estimate (guess) numbers of things?

(e.g. estimate how many apples are in a bag, and then count and check or estimate how many sandwiches daddy needs to make for the family picnic!)

Understanding the World

Ask your daddy/ Grandad lots of questions about his life (what he was like when he was little, what he wanted to be when he grew up, his job now, his hobbies, his favourite holiday, his favourite food etc.)

Talk to your family about what you want to be when you grow up and the other jobs people do.

(fire fighter, police officer, nurse, doctor, teacher, astronaut etc.)

Technology

Can you use a drawing computer program or creative app on a tablet to draw a picture of your daddy/Grandad?

Expressive Arts and Design

Sing Nursery songs and rhymes
