Maths lesson

Complete the sheets below - Subtraction Column Method and Word Problems.

Fill in the missing numbers to complete the subtraction column method calculations. For the final six questions, you will need to **exchange** one of the tens for 10 ones in order to get the answer. Cross out the first digit in

the tens column and write the number that is one less. Then put a 1 next to the first digit in the ones column to show that there are now 10 more ones and 1 less ten. Now you should be able to solve the subtraction calculations normally. Be careful with the last three questions - they're tricky! You will need to exchange to work out the missing numbers.

Then move on to the addition and subtraction word problems. Try to use the column method to solve these problems. Remember to set your numbers above each other in columns.

Have a go at writing your own addition and subtraction word problems and ask an adult to answer them!

Friday SPAG – Contractions

A contraction is a word or phrase that has been shortened to make it easier to say. In order to do this, one or more letters are missed out and replaced by an apostrophe. Often two words are joined together to form a contraction. Remember, the apostrophe always goes where the missing letters are. Most of the time this isn't between the two words. Here are some examples:

do not → don't

should not → shouldn't

will not → won't
