## Great Gorillas Newsletter

In **English** our focus will continue to be based on the story book 'The Journey Home'. We will carry out various activities including identifying missing full stops, planning and writing an alternative version of the original story.

In **Maths** we will be continuing our work based on addition and subtraction. We will be subtracting a one-digit number from a two-digit number and subtracting two, two-digit numbers.

In **P.E.** we will be continuing our gymnastic work.

In **Science** we will learning how the living things in a habitat depend on one another to stay alive.

In **Art** the children will use their drawings/paintings of leaves to create templates to draw around. They will draw around the template and cut the material into leaf shapes. They will then use a felt -tip pen to mark on lines and detail. These shapes will then be stuck onto the background of the whole class collage.

In **Computing** we will be continuing with our coding work.

In **R.E.** we will be learning about the story of the Lost Son. We will be reflecting about what it teaches us about God.



**What could a mobility hub look like?**

The mobility hub is the focus of trips between neighbourhoods, forming a centre around which walking, cycling, public transport and shared mobility networks come together to enable continued movement for medium and long-distance trips.

The hub is co-located with the neighbourhood centre, offering comfort and many local services. It also forms a local employment 'destination' for people who no longer need to commute long distances to the main office, but who value the separation of work and home-life when working remotely.
