This week in **English** we will continue working with the story of Beowulf which links to our topic about the Anglo-Saxons. We will learn about powerful verbs, synonyms, the show not tell technique, how to build tension and we will start planning our next writing piece which will be a hero and monster story.

The spellings for this week are: **actually, certain, experience, history, notice, probably.**

The spelling test will be on Friday and the children will bring home the results for you to see how they've done. Thank you for practicing the spellings with your child at home.

In Reciprocal Reading we will read a text about Beowulf. We will learn some new and interesting words and answer a range of comprehension questions linked to the *Canine Pals*.

Please continue reading at home with your child, sign their reading journal and remember to send it to school on Monday. I check all the journals and swap the reading books on this day so it is really important the children have them at school.

In maths we will start a new topic about Statistics. The times tables test will be on Friday and the focus will be the **7 times tables**.

In science we will continue learning about fossils.


In music we will continue learning songs for our Easter play which we will be rehearsing jointly with class 4.
