Week 5. Communication and language

Focus on the Bible Story 'Jonah and the Whale'

Focus on our 'Prayer Place' by explaining that prayer time is the time when we talk to God. He always listens and talks to us. Ask the children to write a prayer or draw a picture for God and post it in the 'Prayer box.'

ASSESSMENT IS ONGOING (THROUGH OBSERVATIONS)

Week 4. Understanding the World I can begin to make sense of my own life story (3&4 years old)

Focus on a picture of a child and her parents. "This mummy and daddy love their little girl. She loves her mummy and daddy. How do mummies, daddies and children show that they love each other? Let the children respond. God loves each of us all the time. It tells us in the Bible. Open the Bible at Romans 8:38-39 God loves me when I am playing/ sleeping/feeling happy/ feeling sad/ all the time!

Ask 'Who does God love all the time?' 'Where does it tell us about God's love?'
