Since you moved up to this year.

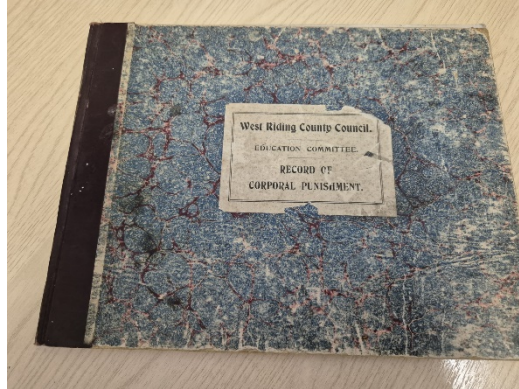
These tests will tell us what you have learned,
