In **English** our focus will continue to be based on the picture book *Gorilla* written by Anthony Browne. We will carry out various activities based on this book, using the pictures as stimulus for our work. We will compare two pictures from the book and discuss the similarities and differences. We will also be writing an alternative story where Hannah and Gorilla go on another adventure. We will be finding out about the author Anthony Browne.

In **Maths** we will be using base ten to explore place value. We will be partitioning numbers to 100 and writing numbers as words.

In **Art** we will be creating patterns using different natural objects. So, don't forget to bring in anything interesting you have collected in a small, named bag.

In **P.E.** we will be continuing our multi-skills – throwing and catching work and gymnastics.

In **Geography** we will be continuing to learn about the continents of our world.

In **Science** we will be learning about how to identify living things. We will be learning about the differences between living and non-living.

In **Music** we will be learning our songs for the Harvest festival.

In **Computing** we will continue with our coding work, and will be discussing key vocabulary used in coding.

In **R.E.** we will be continuing to learn about the story of Jonah and will be reflecting on what it teaches us about God.
