I hope you had a lovely weekend.

In **English** we have finished our independent piece of writing which was a story about a Stone Age Boy based on the book First Drawing by Mordicai Gerstein. The children enjoyed reading the story of the mystery author and identifying the correct punctuation, interesting vocabulary, conjunctions and openers in it. This week we will start our new unit of work and write our own poems.

In spelling we will continue following the Read Write Inc spelling scheme and look at a new spelling rule. The spellings for this week are: explanation, observation, information, preparation, temptation, reservation. The spelling test will be on Friday.

In Reciprocal Reading we will read a text about the activist Greta Thunberg. We will learn some new and interesting words and answer a range of comprehension questions linked to the Canine Pals.

Please remember to read at home with your child, sign their **reading journal** and send it to school every day.

In maths we will continue with the unit about Multiplication and Division. The times tables focus will be the 3, 4 and 8 times tables.

In science we will continue with the Animals Including Humans topic and learn about the human skeleton and the names of different bones.

In RE we will learn about the main Hindu beliefs and Hindu Gods.

In music we will continue learning about reggae.

PE days are Wednesday and Thursday. Please make sure the children come in their PE kits on these days.

Homework this week will be a reading comprehension. It will be set on Thursday and needs to be completed by the following Monday. Please can you encourage your child to complete the homework as it really helps to reinforce their learning.

Please can you make sure that all uniform and equipment is clearly labelled.

This week we will also be making some clay Christmas decorations which we will be selling at the school Christmas fayre on Thursday. We hope that you will be able to attend the event and help us raise much needed funds for our school.
