## Welcome Back Everyone!

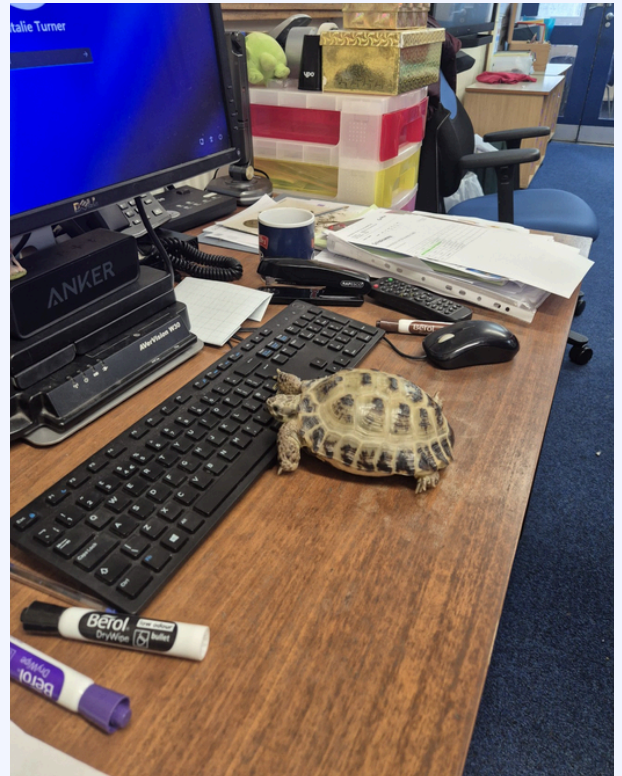

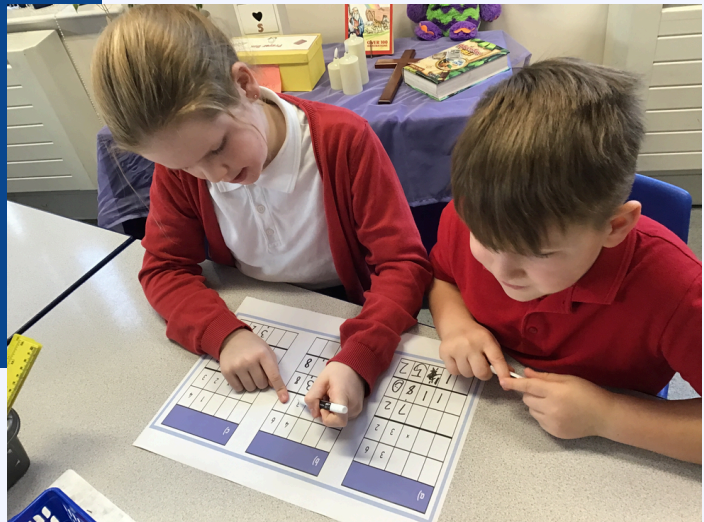
