In Reciprocal Reading we will read a text about Beowulf. We will learn some new and interesting words and answer a range of comprehension questions linked to the Canine Pals.

In maths we will finish our topic about multiplication and division. The focus for this week will be the **9 times tables**.

In RE we will learn about the Fall.

In music we will compose our own music inspired by the piece by Edvard Grieg In the Hall of the Mountain King.

PE days are now Wednesday and Thursday. The children will need to come to school in their PE kits on these days.

Homework this week will be on My Maths. It will be set on Thursday and needs to be completed by the following Monday.
