I am delighted to share the vibrant learning experiences our pupils have been engaging in this week at Tankersley St Peter's Primary School.


Our commitment to mathematical excellence continues to drive our approach to learning. Years 2-6 have been diligently working on their times tables, and I want to be transparent about our current performance. We have noticed a slight movement on our school leaderboards, dropping from 2nd to 5th place. More importantly, we observed that our top ten times tables performers did not include any girls - a challenge we are enthusiastically addressing.

We are currently collaborating with the maths hub to explore the critical importance of times tables mastery. Our expectations are clear:

- Year 2 pupils should confidently know 2, 5, and 10 times tables
- Year 3 pupils should master 2, 5, 10, 3, 4, and 8 times tables
- Year 4 pupils should be proficient in times tables up to 12×12

We cannot overemphasise how fundamental times tables knowledge is - it truly sets our pupils up for lifelong mathematical confidence.

Children are also earning badges for their achievements.



Today, I am proud to support our pupils competing in the dodgeball competition at Hoyland Springwood. We wish them the very best of luck and look forward to hearing about their achievements.

Our younger learners have been exploring creativity and scientific thinking in remarkable ways. The Shining Stars have been developing fine motor skills through sculptural work, creating intricate polar bear models using plasticine. They have been focusing on specific art techniques like pinching and poking, demonstrating remarkable dexterity and artistic expression.

In science, Year 1 pupils demonstrated critical thinking by investigating materials and their properties, specifically considering which material would be most suitable for Pirate Tom's mop. They even used sophisticated scientific vocabulary like "absorb" - a testament to their developing understanding.

I am also excited to share that on Friday, 6th of February, we will be having a Green Day.


