


I would also like to draw your attention to an exciting opportunity for our community. The Barnsley 10k returns for its third year on Sunday 28 June, and this year will see the introduction of the first ever Barnsley Junior Fun Run, taking place immediately after the main race. This is designed entirely around enjoyment and participation, with children progressing through four themed zones: Hype Highway, Water Blast Alley, Bubble Boulevard and Victory Lane. Entries are now open, with only 300 places available, so I would be grateful if you could share this opportunity widely. More news from the classroom

Over recent weeks, our staff have been busy completing termly assessments, and I am genuinely proud of the learning that has taken place across the school. Our pupils are working exceptionally hard, and I want to acknowledge the parents who are equally committed behind the scenes. The difference is truly noticeable when children are supported at home—whether through reading together or practising times tables, which remain a vital life skill they will carry with them always. I must confess, I have been putting those very skills to good use whilst deciding how many Easter cakes to indulge in!

Finally, I wanted to inform you that we have had several reported cases of threadworm within the school over recent weeks. Whilst this is not uncommon in primary-aged children, it is important that we work together to prevent further spread. Threadworm is easily transmitted but can be treated effectively. I kindly ask that you remain vigilant for signs such as itching around the bottom, particularly at night, and seek advice from your pharmacist if you suspect your child may be affected. Treatment is straightforward and usually involves medication for the whole household.
