This week in **English** we will finish gathering skills for our next assessed piece of writing which is a linked to the Ancient Greek myth about Pandora and we will write it up in our best joined up handwriting in our writing assessment books.

The spellings for this week are: **sentence, busy, entry, group, believe, guard**. The spelling test will be on Friday as usual.

In Reciprocal Reading we will read the Ancient Greek myth about King Midas. We will learn some new and interesting words and answer a range of comprehension questions linked to the Canine Pals.
