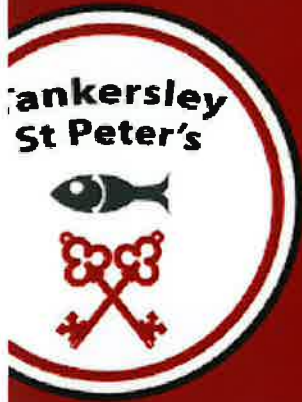

Yesterday brought a flurry of exciting activity across our younger and older pupils. Our nursery children ventured to Sundown Adventure Land for a day filled with adventure and play, returning tired but content.

Simultaneously, our Year 3 pupils visited Magna, our local science adventure centre, where they participated in workshops exploring rockets and materials. They delved into the interactive zones dedicated to fire, earth, air, and water, learning about the characteristics of metals and witnessing the spectacular phenomenon of a fire tornado. The day culminated in joyful exploration of the aqua park, where they got thoroughly soaked whilst having tremendous fun. I am grateful to the staff at Magna for creating such an engaging and enriching experience for our pupils.
